Car Transplants Environmental Policy

Car Transplants Partnership is an Authorised Treatment Facility (ATF) that provides an End of Life Vehicle (ELV) storage, de-pollution and dismantling treatment service. The treatment consists of the de-pollution of waste motor vehicles and the sorting, separation, grading, baling, shearing, compacting, crushing or cutting of ELV's (waste) into different components for **recovery, recycling and re-use**. These environmentally conscious activities relate to our subsequent materials and scrap metal recycling and our waste recovery and re-usable parts sales operations. **Car Transplants Limited** provides an End of Life Vehicle, damaged repairable and repossessed and other vehicle/plant collection and transport and sales service.

Car Transplants recognises the impacts that its operations, activities and waste arisings have on the environment. It maintains a commitment to minimise the adverse effects of those impacts through the implementation and continual improvement of an Environmental Management System (EMS). This EMS applies to all the activities of Car Transplants undertaken at both sites and we are committed to the following key policy principles:

- Integrating the consideration of environmental concerns and impacts into all of our decision making and activities and recognising that the minimum acceptable level of environmental performance and pollution prevention is that set out in current environmental legislation.
- Setting clear environmental objectives and targets and regularly monitoring progress against them.
- Minimising the generation of waste and reducing its environmental impact through responsible identification, segregation, disposal and recycling/re-use options.
- Minimising the use and emission to the environment of any hazardous materials used in the Organisation's processes and activities and sourcing non-hazardous alternatives where commercially viable.
- Purchasing recycled, recyclable and environmentally responsible products where these are available, economical and suitable and working in partnership with suppliers and customers to establish high environmental standards.
- Promoting environmental awareness among employees and training staff about environmental issues that affect their work and their responsibilities in maintaining good environmental management.
- Communicating the Organisation's Environmental Policy and commitments to all staff, suppliers, customers and other interested parties.
